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## **AGENCY’S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS**

In FY 2021-2022, the State Fiscal Accountability Authority (“SFAA” or the “Agency”) consistently worked to fulfill the Agency’s mission of providing fiscal oversight for the State of South Carolina and meeting the needs of the public sector by delivering quality, cost-effective insurance, procurement, and engineering services. The accomplishments reflected in this Report demonstrate the hard work and commitment to excellence of SFAA’s staff and leadership.

Established by the Restructuring Act of 2014, Act 121, SFAA is comprised of the Insurance Reserve Fund Division and the Division of Procurement Services. The Agency is governed by a five-member Authority consisting of: the Governor, the Treasurer, the Comptroller General, the Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, and the Chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee, all of whom serve ex-officio. Administrative and operational functions of the Agency are led by Executive Director Grant Gillespie, who was appointed by the Authority on January 4, 2016.

### **MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS DURING FISCAL YEAR 2021-2022**

#### **Division of Procurement Services (DPS)**

The Division of Procurement Services (DPS) includes four operational sections — Office of State Procurement (OSP), Office of the State Engineer (OSE), Audit and Certification, and Business Operations and Strategic Planning. Some accomplishments achieved by these offices in FY 2021-2022 include the following:

#### **1. Office of State Procurement (OSP)**

##### **A. Contract Management and Assistance**

- In FY 2021-2022, the contract results provided by OSP are as follows:

- OSP established new State Term Contracts for SAS (Analytical Software & Solutions), Print Management, Varonis, Educational Supplies, Education Consulting, Electric School Buses, Microscopes, Municipality Auditing, Firefighter Foam, Fire Trucks & Fire Apparatus, to name a few.
- OSP collaborated with agencies and institutions of higher education to establish critical contracts including: Outside Security Officer Usage for SCDC & DJJ, Levy Source Search Services for Department of Revenue, Spare Bus Parts for Department of Education, License Plate Production for SCDMV, Operations & Maintenance for Palmetto Automated Child Support System (PACSS) for DSS; Hybrid Cloud Computing Solution for USC; Firefighter Cancer Benefits for LLR, Welcome Center Custodial Services for PRT, Alternative Transportation Program for DMH, ERP System for Greenville Tech, Voter Registration System Support for the Election Commission and Multimedia Rights for Athletics for Coastal Carolina.

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- The State realized contractual savings due to strategies designed to reduce the budgetary impacts for state agencies and local governments allowing for greater return on investment. The State realized the following savings through cost avoidance strategies and negotiated savings:

- In addition to the savings listed above, OSP also provided reverse auction services to agencies to drive down pricing in certain commodities which resulted in annual savings of \$1.6 million.

### B. Training and Outreach

- The Office of State Procurement planned and conducted a three-day Procurement Directors Conference at Trident Technical College.
- OSP further developed and grew the Division profile with stakeholder audiences statewide via the monthly DisPatcheS newsletter and special announcements as needed by the Procurement team.

## 2. Office of State Engineer (OSE)

OSE’s primary role is to assist state agencies in acquiring construction services in the manner best suited to the agency’s needs. OSE is responsible to assure that all such acquisitions comply with state law. The State Engineer, as the Building Official and Deputy State Fire Marshal for construction of state buildings and facilities, is responsible for enforcement of all applicable building and fire codes. In addition, OSE serves as the administrator of the State-level Floodplain Management Program for State lands.

- In FY 2021-2022, OSE provided the following services:

- OSE planned and conducted a three-day Facility Directors Conference. Subjects presented included OSE Manual and Procurement Code updates, Task Order Contracts, Brand Name Only Specifications, and Alternative Delivery Methods.

## 3. Audit and Certification

Audit and Certification is responsible for conducting periodic audits of each agency’s procurement operations to determine compliance with the South Carolina Procurement Code and regulations.

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- A. Audit status: Conducted audits and published reports of three agencies, two enterprise campus authorities, two universities, and one governor’s school in FY2021-2022. Two agencies and one university had procurement certification.
- B. Statutorily required reports:
  - Compiled three statewide quarterly reports based upon information received from all state governmental bodies for the following procurement types: Sole Source and Emergency procurements; Trade-in Sales; Unauthorized procurements; Ten Percent Rule; and Applied Preferences.
  - Annual reports were prepared of sole source, emergency, and unauthorized procurements and presented to the State Fiscal Accountability Authority.
- C. School Districts Procurement Codes:  
Approved 25 alternate procurement codes based on the 2021 School District Model Code.

**4. Continued development of eProcurement Solution Project**

- Continued to coordinate and manage the multi-agency collaboration process to secure and implement a new statewide eProcurement Solution system that will provide state agencies, higher education institutions, political subdivisions and suppliers/vendors with a fully integrated SaaS eProcurement technology platform. The SC eProcurement system will streamline the purchasing process, gather more precise data, and provide a more efficient process of collecting vendor fees.

**Insurance Reserve Fund Division (IRF)**

The Insurance Reserve Fund (IRF) is a self-insurance mechanism operated by the State of South Carolina providing insurance to governmental entities at the lowest possible cost. All State agencies must purchase their insurance through the IRF and participation is optional for local governments. The Mission of the IRF is to provide property and liability insurance products that meet the needs of its governmental customers in a financially secure and responsible manner. The Insurance Reserve Fund currently insures more than \$40 billion in property values for State and local government entities. Some accomplishments achieved by the IRF in FY 2021-2022 include the following:

**1. Refined and Updated the IRF Catastrophe (CAT) Plan**

- Prior to Hurricane Season, the IRF convened a meeting of critical business partners including the property reinsurance broker, reinsurance market adjuster, and the designated adjustment company to plan IRF’s insurance response to natural disasters in order to accurately identify necessary resources for timely and efficient claim and payment processing, establish communication protocol and information sharing, and strengthen relationships between the partners. The increase in number, severity, and impact of weather events makes this planning even more mission critical.

**2. Renewed Property Reinsurance**

- The IRF successfully renewed its property reinsurance buying capacity for a 100-year storm. To achieve this renewal, IRF held meetings with Domestic, London, and Bermuda reinsurance

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markets; continued building valuation and appraisal contract work; and improved the quantity and quality of data points collected and reported in the IRF Statement of Values.

### **3. Aligned Vendor Registration Process for Continued Implementation of Uniform Payment Terms**

- The IRF aligned its vendor registration process to complete the transition to the new vendor registration portal. This streamlined vendor enrollment, increased consistency, and reduced delay to direct all vendors to a uniform location to further implement the uniform payment terms adopted by the Office of the State Treasurer.

### **4. Creatively provided training and outreach to enhance State’s Risk Management Practices**

- Coordinated and hosted virtual Underwriting seminars, *Insurance and You*, for all insureds but focused to educate newly employed Underwriting and Claims contacts. These seminars focused on how policyholders can use insurance to meet the needs of the agency while protecting the agency’s budget.
- Coordinated and hosted virtual Medical Professional Risk Management seminars directed to hospitals and Department of Mental Health facilities.
- Hosted annual meetings for specialty lines insurance of Ocean Marine Insurance, Aviation insurance, and UAV/Drone insurance. These meetings connected the specialty line brokers with the insureds to discuss terms of renewal, state of the market, unique issues of coverage, and educational opportunities made available through the broker.

## **Agency-Wide**

### **1. Management of activity related to the five-member Authority**

#### **A. Authority Meeting and Agenda Process**

The Authority held seven meetings during the 2021-2022 Fiscal Year. Prior to each meeting, SFAA staff and the Executive Director held agenda review meetings with internal and external staff and others as needed to develop the meeting agenda and address any matters prior to the meeting.

#### **B. Providing Virtual Access to the Authority Post Pandemic**

SFAA staff continued to provide both in person and videoconference options for meeting attendance for Authority members. Phone and videoconferencing were made available for representatives from entities with agenda items were also provided. These technical capabilities provided no interruptions in the meeting schedule and allowed for agenda items that required timely action by the Authority.

#### **C. Coordination with Authority Members**

The Agency responded promptly to our members’ offices about pending and potential agenda items, such as procurement audits, major leases, composite bank accounts, and management and assignment of bond counsel.

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## 2. Creation of the South Carolina Opioid Recovery Fund Board

- SFAA staff oversaw the establishment and administration of a new quasi-governmental agency — the South Carolina Opioid Recovery Fund Board (“SCORF”), pursuant to the SC Opioid Recovery Act of 2022, SC Code §§11-58-10, *et seq.*, and the Settlement Agreement from *In re South Carolina Opioid Litigation*.

## 3. Strengthened operations through process improvements, cost-saving measures, and compliance with applicable laws.

- A. SFAA IT Improved processes by completing a number of projects, including:
- Migrating the agency to Division of Technology Services’ VPN. This provided fewer disconnects from the network when working remotely and a better work experience.
  - Implementing MS Teams to provide alternative collaboration software that incorporated a unified system with Microsoft office suite with the future plans of implementing OneDrive.

## 4. Implemented Strategic Planning Initiatives

- A. Conducted bi-weekly Management meetings  
The Senior Management team met on a bi-weekly basis to determine progress toward Agency goals and objectives.
- B. Refresh and Update Division Websites  
Internal work groups continued the review and updating of content for the IRF public facing webpage and launched a redesigned webpage to ensure a more user-friendly customer experience.

## 5. Assistance to Agency Head Salary Commission

- SFAA continued to provide staffing support and administrative functions for the Agency Head Salary Commission which primarily administers the agency head performance process.
- Ensured compliance with the requirements of state statutes and Proviso 104.9 by preparing agenda items and supporting materials for the Commissions meetings. Based on market trends and statewide salary data, made recommendations to the Commission regarding agency heads hiring salaries, salary increases, performance evaluations and salary ranges.
- Implemented the requirements of 2021 Act 90 that requires any compensation package, severance package, payment or other benefit conferred to the CEO or member of the board of Santee Cooper to be approved by the Agency Head Salary Commission. An outside consultant was contracted to develop a preliminary market analysis of the compensation for the CEO role at Santee Cooper.


